

**Gala Yuzawa** has unique highspeed-train access and used to be Japan's biggest, but no one goes anymore. Why? The economy tanked, and skiing went out of fashion. They're dismantling lifts fast. The Yellowstone super volcano erupts every 600,000 years, most recently 630,000 years ago. So book that **Jackson Hole** trip soon — it could soon be as flat as lowa.
